

## International Engineering Research Travel Fellowship

We are pleased to provide a new opportunity for Marquette undergraduate students to participate in a high-impact international research collaboration between faculty in the College of Engineering at Marquette University and faculty at the University of Genoa, Italy (UniGe), focused on *physical state estimation for motor control, coordination, and behavior monitoring in people with sensorimotor deficits*.

Recipients of an International Engineering Research Travel Fellowship will participate in a 12-month research project under the mentorship of a Marquette faculty mentor (Dr. Beardsley, Dr. Scheidt or Dr. Medeiros) and a graduate student mentor. During the first 6 months (November to May), students will participate in the design and development of the research project. Students will then travel to Genoa, Italy to engage in an 8-week immersive research experience focused on data collection and data analysis, followed by the dissemination of research findings in the Fall. A stipend for room and board will be provided while the student is in Italy.

To be eligible for this opportunity students must:

- Be a U.S. citizen, national or permanent resident
- Have junior or senior standing in a major or minor in the College of Engineering, the College of Health Science or the College of Arts and Sciences ((at the time of travel)

To apply for this award:

- Complete the table below.
- Provide a 1-page essay describing the reason(s) for your interest in the International Engineering Research Travel Fellowship as well as your knowledge, skills and capabilities that will contribute to your success in working on an international research project in one of the three faculty mentor's laboratories.
- Attach a resume.
- Provide an unofficial transcript.
- Include a list of remaining coursework and a schedule for completing the courses.
- All components of the application should be submitted in one email to [nmcl\\_stroke@marquette.edu](mailto:nmcl_stroke@marquette.edu) by 11:59pm on October 2. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
- **Finally, a letter of recommendation must be submitted separately by the October 2 deadline.** The person completing the letter of recommendation should submit it directly to [nmcl\\_stroke@marquette.edu](mailto:nmcl_stroke@marquette.edu) with the student's name included in the subject line of the email.
